- Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and the Ruby Princess with regard to Human Health Reports it submitted as part of its voyage terminating 19 March in Sydney.
- 2. Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and New South Wales Health with regard to Human Health Reports submitted by the Ruby Princess as part of its voyage terminating 19 March in Sydney.
- Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and either the
 Department of Home Affairs and/or the Australian Border Force with regard to Human
 Health Reports submitted by the Ruby Princess as part of its voyage terminating 19 March
 in Sydney.
- 4. Please table each communication between the Department of Agriculture and the Minister for Home Affairs or his office with regard to Human Health Reports submitted by the Ruby Princess as part of its voyage terminating 19 March in Sydney.
- 5. In relation to Question 1 did any official from the Department of Agriculture specifically ask medical staff on board the Ruby Princess whether patients were displaying symptoms consistent with COVID-19? If yes, who and when?
- 6. In relation to Questions 2 and 3 did any official from the Department of Agriculture raise concerns specifically about the risk of COVID-19 onboard the Ruby Princess with the relevant Departments? If yes, who and when?

Answer:

1. On 16 March 2020, the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment (DAWE) issued a Biosecurity Status Document (BSD) to the Ruby Princess (Attachment 1) in response to the Human Health Reports (HHR) it submitted. DAWE issued another BSD to the Ruby Princess on 19 March 2020 (Attachment 2).

The Ruby Princess submitted the following HHRs to DAWE:

- a. 16 March 2020 at 13:46, as part of a pre-arrival report (Attachment 3)
- b. HHR: 16 March 2020 at 15:01 (Attachment 4)
- c. HHR: 18 March 2020 at 08:54 (Attachment 5)

- d. HHR: 18 March 2020 at 19:21 (Attachment 6)
- 2. There is routine communication between DAWE biosecurity officers and NSW Health officials in relation to vessel arrivals. Written communications relevant to the 19 March 2020 arrival of the Ruby Princess are attached:
 - a. DAWE and NSW Health had an sms exchange commencing at 07:30 (Attachment 7).
 - b. NSW Health copied DAWE into its email to Sydney Port Authority detailing its assessment of the health status of the vessel (Attachment 8).
- 3. There are no such communications.
- 4. There are no such communications.
- 5. In relation to question 1, no official from DAWE specifically asked medical staff on board the Ruby Princess whether patients were displaying symptoms consistent with COVID-19. This information is requested through a HHR prior to a vessel's arrival and. Any change to this information is required to be notified to the department. These reports are made available to the relevant state authority for the purposes of assessing human health risks, which in the case of the Ruby Princess was NSW Health.
- 6. In relation to questions 2 and 3, DAWE's primary mechanism for raising concerns about the risk of listed human diseases, which includes COVID-19, is negative pratique. The attached BSDs show that the Ruby Princess required negative pratique, triggered by the HHRs submitted to DAWE by the Ruby Princess. As indicated above, the HHRs were available to NSW Health to inform their human health assessment.

Separately, a biosecurity officer raised concerns via SMS specifically about the risk of COVID-19 onboard the Ruby Princess with NSW Health (Attachment 7).

Prior to biosecurity officers boarding the vessel, NSW Health had undertaken an assessment of the information provided by the Ruby Princess. NSW Health determined there was a low level of human health risk.

On the morning of 19 March 2020, biosecurity officers reconfirmed with NSW Health the approach to managing passengers and the advice remained there were no concerns relating to passengers leaving the vessel. Biosecurity officers did not intervene with the disembarkation of passengers, consistent with this advice, and allowed passengers to continue to disembark.



All ballast water must be managed in accordance with the Australian Ballast Water Management Requirements. The vessel may commit an offence if unmanaged ballast water is discharged from any tank on this vessel. This includes Australian sourced ballast water intended for discharge within Australian seas

If the vessel becomes aware that the information provided in the Ballast Water Report is incomplete or incorrect, additional or corrected information must be provided as soon as possible. Vessels taking up ballast in the Australian seas are highly encouraged to resubmit an additional Ballast Water Report prior to discharge of Australian sourced water.





They landed 5 samples in Wellington for COVID testing, all were negative. They will be sending about 15 samples for testing to our lab, just to be cautious.


We are not attending because:
