

Submission from Adam Graycar, Professor of public policy, Flinders University.

My research in recent years has focussed on corruption, both globally and in Australia. I have developed methods of classifying corruption in different contexts. These are outlined in the academic literature, and summarised in my book *Understanding and Preventing Corruption* (Palgrave Macmillan, New York 2013).

I have been particularly interested in the integrity structures and enforcement structures that operate to control and prevent corruption.

On 23 February 2016 I delivered a public lecture in Adelaide, and in that lecture made some observations about the nature of a national response to corruption in Australia.
