Subject: Competition and regulation in the online search and advertising market

To the Committee Secretary
Senate Standing Committee on Environment and Communications

I understand that the week before last the Senate Standing Committee on Environment and Communications held an Online Privacy inquiry where search and online advertising issues were discussed. In light of this inquiry I thought the Committee Members might be interested in some research I have been doing on competition in the online search and advertising market.

The research examines the effects of certain behaviours in the marketplace including that targeted by police inquiries into personal data being "mistakenly" collected by Google from Australian home Wi-Fi networks, and the behaviours targeted by the ACCC in a pending Federal Court case against Google for alleged misleading conduct dating back to 2007.

These kind of behaviours have led me to think about the nature of competition and regulation in the online market.
