Inquiry into Teacher Education

Teacher education inquiry heads to Tasmania

The Apple Isle will play host to a parliamentary committee inquiry next week, when the House Education Committee visits Parliament House in Hobart next Wednesday (23 November) and the Launceston Campus of the University of Tasmania next Thursday (24 November).

The House Education Committee is conducting a major inquiry into teacher education.

"Partnerships are an emerging focus of this inquiry," said Committee Chair Mr Luke Hartsuyker MP. "We are keen to learn how the University, the Government, and the Teachers Registration Board work together with schools to address issues such as linking theory to practice. We would also like to hear about any impediments to building stronger partnerships."

As well as hearing from the University of Tasmania and current teacher education students, the Committee will hear from several other organisations and authorities during the public hearings in Tasmania. Among those appearing will be the Tasmanian Government, the Teachers Registration Board of Tasmania, and the Australian Parents' Council Inc.
