Constitutional Change: Not as Simple as Yes or No

Only 76% of Australians of voting age recognise that Australia has a constitution, according to research by the Australian Local Government Association (ALGA). The Legal and Constitutional Affairs Committee will hear ALGA's views on the challenge of changing the constitution at a public hearing this Thursday in Canberra. One of the key difficulties is ensuring that voters understand the proposed change to the constitution.

The Chair of the House of Representatives Committee Mark Dreyfus QC said "The constitution was not designed to be changed easily, but any change needs voters to be engaged and informed. Voters are not fully engaged or informed when 'don't know – vote no' can be put forward as a serious argument.'

"The current legislative provisions only provide for the preparation and distribution of a Yes/No pamphlet. It is appropriate to ask whether the Yes/No pamphlet is the best way for voters to understand proposals for constitutional change," the Committee Chair added.

Under the current legislation, the federal government can only inform voters about a proposal for constitutional change through the Yes/No pamphlet. The purpose of the inquiry is to determine whether this legislation is sufficient in addressing voter requirements in the lead up to a referendum. The inquiry will consider whether there are other ways to provide the public with the same or greater levels of explanatory information.

As part of this public hearing program, the Committee will hear from ALGA and Peter Brent from the Democratic Audit of Australia.
