

Inquiry into future water supplies for Australia's rural industries and communities

Public hearings in Melbourne, Monday 7 & Tuesday 8 April 2003

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee is examining the role of the Commonwealth in ensuring an adequate and sustainable future water supply for communities and industries in rural and regional Australia.

As part of its inquiry, the Committee will visit Melbourne on Monday and Tuesday next week (7 & 8 April) to gather evidence from peak bodies, landowners and water management authorities. The Committee will also take evidence from Pratt Water.

Committee Chair, Mrs Kay Elson MP, says the inquiry has generated considerable interest around Australia, with more than 130 submissions received from concerned organisations and individuals.

"Getting water management right, which includes the balance of allocations between different users, is crucial not only for the prosperity of rural Australia, but the nation as a whole," Mrs Elson said.

"We cannot afford, as a nation, to manage water in an ineffective or inefficient way. The Committee has already received some good suggestions for improvements and is looking for more ideas."
