

Inquiry into future water supplies for Australia's rural industries and communities

Public hearings in Adelaide (28 April) and Port Lincoln (29 April)

The House of Representatives Agriculture Committee is examining the role of the Commonwealth in ensuring an adequate and sustainable future water supply for communities and industries in rural and regional Australia.

As part of its inquiry, the Committee will visit **Adelaide** on 28 April and **Port Lincoln** on 29 April to gather evidence from peak bodies, water management authorities, and other interested persons.

Committee Chair, Mrs Kay Elson MP, says the inquiry has generated considerable interest around Australia, with almost 140 submissions received from concerned organisations and individuals.

"Getting water management right, which includes the balance of allocations between different users, is crucial not only for the prosperity of rural Australia, but the nation as a whole," Mrs Elson said.

South Australia is Australia's driest State. The Murray River supplies about half of the State's water use, with Adelaide deriving almost all its water requirements from that source. The Committee is visiting Port Lincoln to better understand the specific water issues facing rural industries and communities on the Eyre Peninsula, where groundwater is the primary source of water.
