- □ Amendment determination Drugs on F1 and drugs in Part A of F2 (Instrument number PB 2 of 2010), made under subsections 85AB(1) and 85AC(1) of the *National Health Act 1953* [homepage]

Orders for the production of documents

Motion agreed to

The Senate ordered the Minister for Broadband, Communications and the Digital Economy (Senator Conroy) to table the National Broadband Network Implementation Study and government response by no later than 10.00 am on 17 March 2010.

Documents tabled

Documents were tabled in response to an order of the Senate agreed to on <u>25 February 2010</u> relating to proposed sites for a Commonwealth radioactive waste dump.

Senator Milne gave a <u>notice of motion</u> to require the documents referred to in resolutions of the Senate agreed to on <u>16 September 2009</u> and <u>18 November 2009</u> to be tabled by 10.00 am on 18 March 2010.

The Minister for Climate Change, Energy Efficiency and Water (Senator Wong) tabled a ministerial statement about the home insulation program [a motion to take note of the statement was debated and agreed to – <u>first speaker</u>].
