<u>Telecommunications (Consumer Protection and Service Standards)</u> <u>Amendment Bill (No. 2) 2000</u>–The message reported that the House of Representatives had agreed to amendments nos 3 to 16 and disagreed to nos 1 and 2 made by the Senate, making substitute amendments for the two disagreed to. The Senate agreed to the substitute amendments. [This bill will now be assented to]
