Death of former member

The President informed the Senate of the death, on 31 July 2011, of the Honourable Allan Clyde Holding, a former minister and member of the House of Representatives for the division of Melbourne Ports from 1977 to 1998. A <u>motion</u> moved by the Deputy Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Conroy) was carried [first speaker].

Death of Nancy Grace Augusta Wake

The Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) moved a <u>motion of</u> <u>condolence</u> on the death, on 7 August 2011, of Nancy Grace Augusta Wake, AC, GM. The motion was carried [<u>first speaker</u>].

Questions on notice–Failure to provide answers

<u>Senator Cormann</u> asked the Minister representing the Treasurer (Senator Wong) why an answer had not been provided to question on notice no. 437 asked on 11 March 2011 relating to the stimulus package. Senator Wong <u>responded</u> and a motion moved by Senator Cormann to take note of the response was debated and agreed to [first speaker].

<u>Senator Humphries</u> asked the Minister representing the Minister for Foreign Affairs (Senator Conroy) why an answer had not been provided to questions on notice nos 232 and 274 asked on 29 November 2010. <u>Senator Conroy</u> provided an explanation. A <u>motion</u> moved by Senator Humphries to take note of the explanation was agreed to.

Temporary chair of committees

A warrant was tabled nominating Senator Coonan as a temporary chair of committees.
