Financial Sector Legislation Amendment Bill (No. 1) 2000–committee of the whole commenced–1 Government amendment agreed to; 1 Opposition amendment moved Health Legislation Amendment (Minimum Proficiency Requirements for Medical Practitioners) Bill 2000–This bill was created when the Senate agreed to a motion moved by Senator Lees to instruct the committee of the whole to divide the Health Legislation Amendment Bill (No. 4) 1999 into two separate bills. The Senate also agreed to two other motions moved by Senator Lees: to amend the new bill and to postpone further consideration of the bill until the first day of sitting in June 2001
