The Senate did not agree to a motion requiring the Minister representing the Treasurer (Senator Wong) to table <u>information relating to the modelling of the carbon tax</u>—no later than noon on 2 December 2011.

# Notice of motion

Senators Fierravanti-Wells and Di Natale gave a <u>notice of motion</u> to require the Minister representing the Minister for Health and Ageing and the Minister representing the Minister for Human Services to table a report from Medicare Australia on matters relating to the Medicare Chronic Disease Dental Scheme–no later than 5.00 pm on 7 February 2012.

# Proposed suspension of standing orders

The Senate debated but did not agree to a motion moved by the Leader of the Opposition in the Senate (Senator Abetz) to suspend standing orders to enable debate on a motion allowing the Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) to provide an explanation about the secret deal between the Prime Minister (Ms Gillard) and the Australian Greens relating to the mining tax [first speaker].

# Question on notice-Failure to provide answer

<u>Senator Ludlam</u> asked the Minister representing the Treasurer (Senator Wong) why an answer had not been provided to question on notice no. 686 asked on 14 June 2011 relating to the Census 2011 and the homelessness count. Senator Wong provided an explanation. A <u>motion</u> moved by Senator Ludlam to take note of the explanation was agreed to.
