The President informed the Senate of the death, on 28 October 2012, of the Honourable Gordon Neil Bilney, a former minister and member of the House of Representatives for the division of Kingston from 1983 to 1996. A <u>motion</u> moved by the Leader of the Government in the Senate (Senator Evans) was carried [first speaker].

Question on notice-Failure to provide answer

<u>Senator McKenzie</u> asked the Minister representing the Attorney-General (Senator Ludwig) why an answer had not been provided to question on notice no. 2009 asked on 13 August 2012 relating to recovery grants from the National Disaster Relief and Recovery Arrangement. <u>Senator Ludwig</u> indicated that a response would be provided. A motion moved by <u>Senator McKenzie</u> to take note of the Minister's failure to provide either an answer or an explanation was agreed to.
