New Business Tax System (Integrity Measures) Bill 2000–(<u>2 Democrat amendments</u> agreed to) [The House of Representatives agreed to the Senate amendments. The bill will now be assented to.]

New Business Tax System (Miscellaneous) Bill (No. 2) 2000–(<u>25 items and 4 sections negatived</u>, <u>4 Democrat amendments agreed to</u>) [The House of Representatives agreed to the Senate amendments. The bill will now be assented to.]

Telecommunications (Consumer Protection and Service Standards) Amendment Bill (No. 1) 2000–(9 Democrat amendments agreed to) [The House of Representatives agreed to the Senate amendments. The bill will now be assented to.]
