The Minister for Finance and Deregulation (Senator Wong) tabled the <u>Budget statement</u> for the year 2012-13 and <u>associated budget papers</u> and ministerial statements.

The Senate <u>referred</u> budget documents to legislation committees to enable them to consider estimates. Estimates hearings will take place from 21 to 31 May 2012.

The Opposition and other parties will make their responses to the Budget statement on Thursday, 10 May 2012.
