Thursday, 15 March 2012

The Senate met from 9.30 am until 11.07 pm

Condolence motions

The President informed the Senate of the death on 12 March 2012 of the Honourable Douglas Barr Scott, former senator for the state of New South Wales in 1970 and from 1974 to 1985, former Deputy President of the Senate from 1978 to 1979 and former Federal Minister for Special Trade Representations from 1979 to 1980. A motion moved by the Parliamentary Secretary for School Education and Workplace Relations (Senator Collins) was carried [first speaker].
