Public hearings in Melbourne for inquiry into teacher education

Five Victorian universities involved in teacher education will have the opportunity to put forward their views about how well teachers are being prepared for the classroom when they appear before a parliamentary committee in Melbourne on Tuesday.

The House Education Committee is conducting a major inquiry into teacher education.

"We are interested in exploring with the universities how they select students, the nature and extent of the practicum they provide and how they prepare teachers to deal with the immense complexities and challenges that are part of the role of teaching today," said Committee Chair Mr Luke Hartsuyker MP.

"Last week we heard the results of a survey conducted by the Australian Secondary Principals Association on what beginning teachers think about their preparation for teaching. We will be very interested to hear the universities' perspectives on some of these results."

The Committee will also hear from a number of other organisations and from current teacher education students.
