Human milk for human babies

Public hearing and site inspection Wednesday 18 April Mothers Milk Bank - John Flynn Private Hospital, Gold Coast

As part of the House Health and Ageing Committee's inquiry into the health benefits of breastfeeding, the Committee will hold a public hearing and inspect the Mothers Milk Bank which is based at John Flynn Private Hospital on the Gold Coast, Queensland.

"The milk bank, one of only two in Australia is an important development for babies who are sick or premature. Giving these babies breastmilk increases their chances of survival and helps their long-term development," Committee Chairman Alex Somlyay said.

Under the terms of reference, the Committee is also interested in examining the effectiveness of current measures to promote breastfeeding and will hear evidence from several hospitals which are accredited under the Baby friendly Health Initiative. This initiative aims to give every baby the best start in life by creating a health care environment where breastfeeding is the norm and practices known to promote the health and well-being of all babies and their mothers are followed.

The House of Representatives Committee will also hear from several specialists involved in neonatal and paediatric care.

The hearing is open to all members of the public.
