## Inquiry into ageing - first public hearing Government departments and agencies appearing

The House of Representatives has established a Committee to examine long-term strategies to address the ageing of Australia's population over the next 40 years.

The Committee, chaired by Dr Andrew Southcott MP, will be holding its first public hearing this Friday, 7 February, in Canberra.

At this first hearing the Committee will hear from a range of government departments and agencies, as well as a senior academic and the national peak body representing church and charitable aged care providers (Aged and Community Services Australia).

"It is clear that the ageing of Australia's population will have a profound impact on all facets of social, economic and political activity," Dr Southcott said.

"In terms of economics, population ageing will have an impact on economic growth, savings, investment and consumption, labour markets, pensions, taxation and intergenerational transfers. In the social policy area, population aging affects health and health care, family composition and living arrangements, housing and migration. Politically, population ageing may influence voting patterns and representation.

"In comparison to other developed countries, Australia is well placed to deal with an ageing population. However, this does not mean we can be complacent. It is critical that public policy is developed that takes into account population ageing. This inquiry is a significant part of the process of laying the strong foundations that can be built on to meet the future needs of all Australians."
