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SUBMISSION TO THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES SELECT COMMITTEE ON THE RECENT AUSTRALIAN BUSHFIRES

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Dear Sir

As a long-time Tawanga resident and a former Country Fire Authority member 1 feel compelled to contribute to the Federal Government's buildire review. I place my faith in this Committee taking that necessary steps required to ensure our country's future forest management policies and procedures make certain we do not have a repeat of this symmer's buildire crists.

I feel it is imperative that the following two points are made:

- The 2003 summer bushine crisis in North-East Victoria could have been prevented had the State Government ensated connect forest management and fuel reduction policies.
- The Victorian State Department of Sustainability and Environment and Parks Victoria managed these fires poorly and should should a some of the blame for the devastation these fires caused.

Fuel reduction burning in the Bogong National Park is North-East Victoria has herer been conducted and there is limit doubt that had back-burning occurred and had stock been permitted to graze in the park, substantially loss of the parklands would have been ravaged by these lines.

I graze 110 adult cattle in the Bogong National Park and I can attest that the graisland area of this park where the cattle graze was only minimally burnt. In contrast, areas of parkland where Parks Vizionia prohibit cattle and where the State Government has folled to conduct fuel reduction burning and has allowed the forest floor material accumulate, were destroyed by these lation fires.

I would estimate that 65% of my run at Bagang National Park is avergrown and inaccessible to my come and this area was uttarly destroyed by the fires. A more 5% of the remaining part of my run where cattle can be grazed was only slightly affected by these fires.

The fire spotted onto my cattle run of 10.50am on Tuesday 21st of January. The Klewa Hydro Power Company had workers on site by 12-noon. They requested an perophene from the DSE base at Dinner Plain to extinguish this fire. DSE refused their request and utionately the Southern Catchment adjacent to Rocky Valley Dan was destroyed. This fire eventually extinguished itself and luddly the most bade were not affected. Had the most bads caught alight it is not untiltikable that they would still be burning today.

Our area has been deeply scarred by the fires and they continue to have a great affect on our local tourism industry and businesses.

One of many examples is the destruction of the Old Roper Hut an Duane Spur. This is an important stop for walkers travelling from Mr Bogang to Mr Hotham and I believe stops should be taken to rebuild this hur.

The Mount Beauty Timber Mill closed prior to Carlstones due to a lack of timber, this meant that at least thirty local jobs were lost. It would be a temble shame if this mill were not permitted to process the burst mountain ash from the first.

Many comparisons have been made between these first and those of 1939, however such comparisons are unjust and propositionus, primarily because the weather conditions leading up to the 1939 fires were substantially different.

As I have stated, the intensity and magnitude of the 2003 fires could have best prevented and the devastation of these fires would not have been as great lead the Vistorian little Government practiced correct forest management and fire prevention techniques over the past decade.

At the very least, had cattle grazing been permitted in our forests, the undergrawth would not have been as thick and the fires would not have been as intense and have burni for so long and the communities of the North-East Victoria would not have been confronted by a cliscister of such sheer magnitude.

i anticipate that with good rains this country will rejuvanate very quiddy. Our last is very resilient and not as fragile as the green movement purports. Locals of the North-East have always bottled on in the face of adversity and I have no doubt that our formers who have been forming this land for generations, will continue to do so.
