

The Committee Secretary, House Select Committee on the recent Australian Bushfires, Department of the House of Representatives, Parliament House, Canberra, ACT 2600

Dear Sir/Madam,

I am submitting information to this Committee because I feel strongly that not enough is done to minimize loss of life when fire strikes. I was deeply upset by the loss of life in the recent Canberra bushfires and could only think – if the REM (Ross Escape Module) had been available to people then this tragic loss of life would not have occurred.

I am an individual with limited resources, I am not in a position to send in a highly professionally prepared submission. I am sending the enclosed information with the hope that this Committee – with all the resources that you have at your command – can find out what has happened to the REM and could it be developed in the future so as to be available to the public; then bushfires need not be so destructive of human life.

The following applies particularly to sections f and h of the Inquiry.

For some years I lived in Melbourne, from about 1989 knew Ross Connell slightly, met him occasionally, heard about how he was trying to develop the REM. In 1996 I moved to Adelaide, apart from a phone call to Ross in 1998 I have not heard of him since. After the tragic Canberra fires I tried to contact him re the REM but without success.

The REM has been designed as a water tank – with special valves so in an emergency water can be released, people can get inside the tank and be safe; the REM could be used on fire trucks as a water tank or as a water tank/home shelter in a private home.
