Government and research groups attend Hobart coastal inquiry

The House of Representatives Climate Change, Water, Environment and the Arts Committee will be in Hobart for a public hearing on Wednesday 28 January 2009 to hear from a range of organisations as part of its inquiry into climate change and environmental impacts on Australia's coastal zone.

The Committee will hear from scientists from CSIRO and the Antarctic Climate and Ecosystems CRC undertaking leading research on sea level rise, as well as from a coastal mapping expert from the University of Tasmania.

"The Committee will be seeking an update on the latest science concerning sea level rise, and how this information can be used by coastal decision-makers to inform the development of adaptation responses", Committee Chair Ms George said.

The Committee will also hear from representatives from the state and local government.

"As the Tasmanian Local Government Association submission notes, 'Tasmania has more coastlines per unit of land area than any other state in Australia and no place in Tasmania is more than 115 kilometres from the sea".

"The potential impact of sea level rise on local coastal communities is therefore of great concern", Ms George said.
