



Public hearing in Canberra – 31 May

Tuning into community broadcasting

The Community Broadcasting Association of Australia (CBAA) will appear at the second public hearing for the inquiry into community broadcasting in Canberra tomorrow. The inquiry is being conducted by the Standing Committee on Communications, Information technology and the Arts.

The CBAA is the national representative organisation for community broadcasters. The CBAA will discuss the opportunities and threats affecting the overall future prospects for the community broadcasting sector.

Committee Chair Jackie Kelly said there are some very strong and vibrant community broadcasters in Australia, but others struggle.

“The Committee is keen to hear how community broadcasters work and how they contribute to Australian society. We want to know what the particular threats are to the survival of community broadcasters and we will be looking at ways to support the sector” Mrs Kelly said.

The Federal Minister for Communications, Information Technology and the Arts, Senator Helen Coonan, has requested the Committee to inquire into and report on:

- The scope and role of Australian community broadcasting across radio, television, the internet and other broadcasting technologies;
- Content and programming requirements that reflect the character of Australia and its cultural diversity;
- Technological opportunities, including digital, to expand community broadcasting networks; and
- Opportunities and threats to achieving a diverse and robust network of community broadcasters.
