You may only let this after the closing date for submissions, but I beg your indulgence.I only received the enclosed letter from ACCC by the afternoon mail today.I think it is relevant to the Inquiry. I know that there is no limit on how many Commercial Radio Broadcasting Lixences any one person/group/company can own, but I was **concerned** by what I saw as monopoly and anticompetition.

I don't know if ACCC can only handle one issue at a time, but it seems to me that, when a person/company in Sydneybuys all the commercial radio broadcasting licences in a particular regional/rural town; sacks most of the local staff; eliminates local services (ie talkback, local advertisin country style music, crop and stock sales information, etc.,) and networks them all from the same Sydney radio station, they have created a honopoly, and eliminated competition.

The local ABC, by its charter cannot competent these levels. I submit that, if there is no limit on how many commercial radio broadcasting licences any one person or company can own in a regional or rural town, there should be a limit on how many such licences they can own in a group of connected regional/rural centres.

I intend to answer the ACCC letter.

Radio Industry Inquiry

I refer to your letter of 25 October 2000 in relation to the Radio Industry Inquiry. You allege that there are presently 12 companies holding over 200 commercial broadcasting licences and that they are in the process of increasing their holdings. You state that this should be of interest to the Commission because of our interest in monopolies.

Before proceeding further, it may be appropriate to outline briefly the *Trade Practices Act* 1974 ('the Act') and the Commission's role. The main purpose of the Act is to promote competition and efficiency in markets within Australia and to protect consumers and business from unlawful anti-competitive and unfair market practices. The Commission's role is to seek compliance with the Act. Its primary role in fostering fair and informed markets is to identify important issues as they emerge and to develop national or industry-wide solutions. It is not a complaint-handling authority and cannot provide legal advice.

On your behalf, I have spoken to Mr Bruce Flood from the Australian Broadcasting Authority (ABA) in relation to the granting of commercial broadcasting licences. He has advised that the Broadcasting Services Act, which is legislation administered by the ABA, provides the rules and guidelines for the granting of these licences around Australia. He further advised that the current rules allow for companies to own more than one licence.

Anti-Competitive Behaviour

You allege that there is a monopoly in the operation of commercial broadcasting licences. In general, evidence of a corporation having a monopoly or a substantial market share in a particular market does not by itself invoke a breach of the Act. The Act does prohibit a corporation with a substantial degree of power in a market misusuing that power for certain proscribed purposes, including eliminating or damaging a competitor or preventing a person engaging in competitive conduct. However on the information you have provided there is no



suggestion of such conduct. My understanding is that the ABA is responsible for granting the licences in question.

The anti-competitive provisions of the Act are applicable to Commonwealth Governments and Commonwealth government Authorities in as far as the government is carrying on a business. However the Act provides the granting, refusing to grant, revoking, suspending or varying of licences (whether or not they are subject to conditions) do not amount to carrying on a business. Accordingly those provisions of the Act do not apply to the conduct of ABA in granting the licences in question. In this instance I am unable to take any further action in this matter.
