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IN my opinion country and regional listeners rely heavily on the ABC for many reasons, the main one being that the commercial services don't come within a country mile of matching the BC. Anyone living outside metropolitan areas would have to agree with me.

For instance, the region in which I live (Manning/Forster-Tuncurry, Buladelah and Cloucester) is served by two commercial stations, which rely mainly on a mixture of 'Golden Oldies' and relayed talkback shows. On the other hand, the AEC provides an invaluable service of FM classic, Radio National, regional radio and Triple JJJ. These four AEC stations entertain, inform, educate and provide balanced newcasts and analysis; in the case of newscasts, the time allocated extends well beyond what the commercial stations are providing. Of course the ABC radion services can be improved-for that matter anything can- but threats of further cuts to the AEC can only be judged with grave concern, especially by country dwellers. Having been in the commercial media for more than 35 years I believe the AEC more than matches its commercial opponents across the the entire spectrum of radio and television.
