# TERMS OF REFERENCE FOR THE NOT-FOR-PROFIT SECTOR REFORM COUNCIL

#### **Purpose**

The Not-for-Profit Sector Reform Council (the Council) will be established by the Commonwealth Government for three years to support the Office for the Not-for-Profit Sector (the Office) to implement the Government's commitment to smarter regulation, reduced red tape and improved transparency and accountability of the sector.

#### Role

The role of the Council is to provide support to the Office in its role to drive and coordinate the Government's not-for-profit sector reform agenda.

The Council will provide advice to the Government on not-for-profit issues, including:

- examining the scope of a national 'one-stop shop' regulator for the sector including its role, feasibility and structure;
- streamlining Commonwealth Government tendering and contracting processes for government funded not-for-profit organisations, including the development of a common form contract; and
- harmonisation of fundraising and other Commonwealth, state and territory laws.

The Council will also provide advice on the Productivity Commission's report into the notfor-profit sector and other related reviews.

The Council will also support the implementation of the National Compact: working together.

# Membership

Membership of the Council will be determined by the Minister for Social Inclusion.

The Council will be led by a Chair and Deputy Chair.

The Council will meet up to four times per year face-to-face. Additional meetings will be conducted via phone conference.

#### Governance

The Council will work closely with the Office for the Not-for-Profit Sector. The Council may convene working groups as necessary to consider particular issues in depth and report back to the full Council. These sub-groups may consult external experts in the field to inform their deliberations.

# Secretariat

Secretariat will be provided by the Office for the Not-for-Profit Sector.
