Adolescent Overload?

Media Conference: Education and Training Committee tables its report for school and work inquiry

The House of Representatives Standing Committee on Education and Training tabled its report *Adolescent Overload?* on its inquiry into combining school and work: supporting successful youth transitions. The inquiry looked at the impact of the potentially competing demands of study and part-time or casual employment on youth.

The report was tabled in the House last night and makes 13 recommendations, which include:

- the development and implementation of a national generic skills passport for secondary students to document the employability skills they develop through activities undertaken outside school, including paid and unpaid work, community/volunteer activities, sporting and recreational activities and other life experiences;
- the establishment of a national Employer of Choice for Youth program to recognise the contribution of model employers of young workers; and
- ensuring that structured workplace opportunities are available to all students participating in school-based vocational education and training.
