Shortage of teacher librarians – a major concern for ACT school libraries

An ACT perspective on the issues facing school libraries will be presented when the Australian School Library Association (ACT) appears before the House of Representatives Education Committee, as part of an inquiry into school libraries and teacher librarians in Australian schools.

ASLA ACT is the professional association for all those interested in, or engaged in, aspects of education in school libraries in the ACT. It aims to promote the interests of Teacher Librarians by providing a forum for professional discussion and growth.

"While there are some consistent messages coming through in written submissions and oral evidence, it is important that the committee gains a balanced and informed response by understanding the issues as they affect each jurisdiction," Committee Chair Sharon Bird (Member for Cunningham, NSW) said.

"ASLA ACT has raised concerns in its submission over the number of schools in the ACT which do not have a trained teacher librarian. It has also described the career path for Teacher Librarians as 'nonexistent' and the committee looks forward to examining these issues in more detail."
