Teacher Librarianship: a profession evolving

The School of Information Studies at Charles Sturt University (CSU) is the only dedicated Library and Information Studies (LIS) school located in an Australian university, accounting for over half of LIS graduates in Australia. Representatives from CSU will appear before the House of Representatives Education Committee at a public hearing tomorrow as part of the Committee's inquiry into school libraries and teacher librarians in Australian schools.

In its submission, CSU has recommended that every primary and secondary school in Australia have fully qualified teacher librarianship personnel, staffed on a pro rata basis based on school enrolment.

"As a major educator in the field of teacher librarianship, CSU is well-positioned to comment on the future of teacher librarians and where it believes the profession is heading, and how the role of the teacher librarian is changing in the digital information age," said Committee Chair, Sharon Bird MP (Member for Cunningham, NSW).
