One high school has even eradicated its library completely in favor of a computer centre, the principal arguing that fiction can be obtained 'if anyone is interested' from his council library. Most schools I visit *may* have a library technician – if they're lucky – or have one or a half day of teaching hours devoted to library maintenance. I would request that the committee looks into this very seriously and advocates spending more money in this important area.
