## **Conservation: who gains, who pays?** *SA farmers, National Trust and Government at federal inquiry into conservation measures imposed on landholders*

The House of Representatives Environment Committee, chaired by the Hon Ian Causley MP, will hold a public hearing in **Adelaide** on **Thursday, 22 February**, to hear State Government, farmer and land-manager views on the impact of conservation measures imposed on private landholders.

The House Environment Committee is currently holding a number of public hearings around Australia as part of its inquiry into 'public good conservation'. The Committee is interested in the effect, including costs, of requirements to undertake conservation measures, such as protecting or rehabilitating native vegetation on private land.

The House Environment Committee is seeking information and ideas on:

- ~ how to decrease the financial burden on landholders of carrying out conservation measures;
- ~ ways of ensuring that the costs of public good conservation are shared by all; and
- ~ how to distinguish measures that largely benefit the landholders themselves from measures that largely benefit the public at large, and how to cost these measures.

As part of its inquiry, the Committee is also visiting rural areas to see how landholders are dealing with the conservation measures imposed on them, and hear their views on how they could be helped to undertake public good conservation activities.
