This is an injustice that I have had to suffer. Its alright for all those people in the cities to want to save the trees etc but I am the one that bears the cost of it . I am the one that is responsible for the rabbits in that area , I'm the one responsible for the weeds, I'm the one who has to do the fencing around the area. I can't heavily stock the area in case I harm the trees . I believe that I should have been entitled to some form of compensation or even better still they could have bought the land at valuation , the cost of saving native vegetation would have then been borne by all the community

In our community there is a lot of examples of how regulations are making it harder for farmers to survive. Farmers in the main are into conservation but I believe that regulations have gone too far here in Victoria
