I am a father of a beautiful 8 month old girl, and a proud father at that. From the time was born, I have cared for her in all aspects of parenting, with the exception of the obvious breast feeding, since birth. My ex wife's reasons for taking my baby away were all personal, she was using the stolen over a child and use the child as a pawn? I am pleading to you as a loving father, please get involved in the current debate of joint residence. Please put yourself in my shoes and the shoes of thousands of fathers Australia wide. Even if for 30 seconds, how would you feel if someone tore children away?
