Recently, I have been contacted by a constituent in my Electorate, **1** and **1**

the Child Support Agency to his ex-wife, custodial parent of their 15 year old daughter.

Mr. **When** initial grievance to our office was in regard to his daughter staying with him for 7 nights concurrently for which he believed he should not have to pay his exwife \$141.00 for that period. My electorate staff explained that child support is based on an entire calendar year and his daughter would have to stay with him for 110 nights or more in the year for his payments to be reduced. Mr. **When** argued that although his daughter has frequent and regular visits with him it was not possible for her to stay over night because of school. Mr. **When** s daughter lives with her mother (his ex-wife) in another town.

Mr. In would like to have more control over the money he provides for his daughter's upbringing. It is possible for him to set up a trust fund or something similar for his daughter, however his wife must be in total agreement with this and she is not.

My question to the Standing Committee is; what improvements are being investigated to meet the needs of parents like Mr.
