Hello,

I would dearly like your opinion on the following.

I am a recently separated father who is now paying CSA. I have recently joined the work force and am also paying back my HECS and SSF from my university degree. I have done some calculations using the CSA formula to work out payments in different income categories and have revealed some major concerns that I would appreciate some justification on. By the way my Ex is not working nor intends to.

If I make \$25000 per year and receive a promotion and make \$30000 per year. I actually receive \$8.80 less a week, she receives an additional \$27 per week. Therefore is of more benefit to her.
