I giso have another son in year 12 and an the administrator for my nother in laws financial affairs (she is in cave and take my mother (aged 87) shopping + to doctors appointments □ More information is attached on a separate sheet

1. The role and contribution of carers in society

As a carer, I feel that my role is...

Undervalued and underpaid. Icannot work as my son needs constant supervision, so when he is at his daycentre that is when I do house work washing shopping etc. Up ontil he was aged 16 I was not eligible for even a part pension as he was not "medically" disabled, even though he was fully depend ant on me.

2. The barriers to social and economic participation for carers

As a carer, I face the following problems ...

Respite is few and for between and too shout a time. It is not mostly when it suits me but when it suits the service provider. We usually need to know about 4 menths in advance if there is a wedding or party in order to get overnight facility based respite otherwise theory is all we can get from local council on shouter notice More information is attached on a separate sheet

3. The practical measures required to better support carers

As a carer, I need help with ...

Facility pased respite. Governments prefer in home respite as it is cheaperto provide and is appropriate for some, but not for us. My son needs to be out + about or hegets bored and becomes difficult. Olso I would like to walk around my own house without unlocking doors and have my other sons for ends over live a normal life at times More information is attached on a separate sheet

4. Strategies to assist carers to access opportunities and choices

I think the Government can better help carers by ...

understanding that not all disabled people are physically inpaired, and many will live long lives. also, by grouping disability services with aged care services because the needs are similar on aggivernment level is inappropriate needs as in reality their desabilities are poles apart
