My husband's expertise is in the coal industry and as a result we live in a small town.

- The advantages are Tara (32 year old uncontrolled epileptic with brain damage) is known and loved in the town.
- She is accepted into many of the activities with mainstream activities eg. Pottery, art group, and exercise classes.

My plea to the committee is to consider:

• Respite.

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- Quality Respite.
- Respite accessible to all Australians.
- Funding to transport clients to Respite.
- Respite that incorporates exercises and social activities.
- More Respite.
- Regular Exercise Programs.

Queensland Health provides an exercise program to the seniors and disabled in Blackwater once a week. This provides our daughter with series of exercises, weight training, and stretches which helps her overall balance, walking ability, confidence and weight control as well as a social outing.

It has been impossible for me to work in paid employment.

## The above suggestions can assist many people unlike the individual programs that only help a select few – often those who cry the loudest.

I look forward to hearing the results of this inquiry and hope that our ideas will be given careful consideration.
