I am submitting to the Inquiry because...

I got a complete shock when I took over the full-time caring of my "frail-aged" elderly mother, who had recently lost my father. Talk about being taken for granted! And not just by siblings.  More information is attached on a separate sheet

#### 1. The role and contribution of carers in society

As a carer, I feel that my role is...

To engender, as seems to be necessary (!), maintain, ensure and further the dignity and self-respect of the 'caree'. To try to discern and understand the differences between anger and frustration, disdain and shame - and to mitigate, emotionally, where possible. To encourage autonomy of the spirit. #### 2. The barriers to social and economic participation for carers

As a carer, I face the following problems ...

⇒ Skill set degeneration; fiscal barriers to addressing this  
⇒ Lack of opportunity to feel like an independent adult (it's always about someone else)  
⇒ Knowledge and experience of the fact that the 'caree' demands (mostly emotional - very draining) go up the more  More information is attached on a separate sheet

**3. The practical measures required to better support carers**

As a carer, I need help with ...

- ⇒ Skills (mainly computer) maintenance and improvement;
- ⇒ Access to Lifelong Learning Principles and Products/opportunities (unaffordable at present);
- ⇒ Once-a-month, face-to-face professional counselling.

**4. Strategies to assist carers to access opportunities and choices**

I think the Government can better help carers by ...

- ⇒ Providing free online CBT<sup>S</sup> (Computer Based Training), with content focussed on self-care, skillset improvement, guilt & worry issues, and hobby interests - weekly.
- ⇒ Free broadband connectivity through Government sites to research sites, such as ABS, Carers' Aust., various thinktanks & policy sites, etc.
