I wish to make a submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Family, Community, Housing and Youth's Inquiry into Better Support for Carers.

I am submitting to the Inquiry because...

I don't see much hope or light at the end of the day. For each item of support I receive the battle has been immense.

Agencies supply inefficient staff, school supply inefficient staff & support agencies do not have enough staff and I end up being the support person.

1. The role and contribution of carers in society

As a carer, I feel that my role is...

to aid and promote my son's life and skills, from home base through to his out and about in the general community. To have DHSS and like understand that my son will always need a high level of support throughout his life.

2. The barriers to social and economic participation for carers

As a carer, I face the following problems ...

There is not enough flexibility and simply not enough hours in respite to be able to participate in a social life. All the hours of and for respite are taken up for my sons programs either from council or flexicare from the agency. Then of course I simply don't have the finances as a general rule.

To participate anyway, I receive a reduced carers payment due to a benefit clause that I had half years before I married, let alone children that is now heavily valued by council in the past 3 years - b.p 107.97% ??!! that causes grief.

3. The practical measures required to better support carers

As a carer, I need help with ...

a better understanding that just because I am at home, I also care for an elderly parent, it is okay for anyone connected with my son's program, respite or formal respite, to assume that I will pick up the slack when anything at all is cancelled for the day or time of respite. As it is not possible for me to be in "the workforce", I do say I work for the Government, due to unreliable pickup & drop off times and sickness of son, I am on duty 24/7 - not many do this - needs better communication & flexible hours of respite.

4. Strategies to assist carers to access opportunities and choices

I think the Government can better help carers by ...

Cross speaking to all agencies & groups both government & private may help. Bettering of respite hours that will allow flexibility. To know that futures for Young Adults will continue, so far, this has changed in funding this year to restrict the broadness of funding. This certainly causes more anxiety across the board including myself - no peace of mind. More information is attached on a separate sheet. We need peace of mind. Governments do not give you peace of mind.

Thank you for taking my views into consideration as part of the Committee's Inquiry. I look forward to reviewing any recommendations you make to improve life for carers in Australia.
