I wish to make a submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Family, Community, Housing and Youth's Inquiry into Better Support for Carers.

I am submitting to the Inquiry because...

Carers need all the support & recognition they can get, as well as more financial help. And because Carers don't work 9-5 we can't turn off our job and go home.

1. The role and contribution of carers in society

As a carer, I feel that my role is...

Very important to the person I care for and all of my family. I became my husband's carer 10 yrs ago, I was 54 years old, I gave up work. So for 10 yrs I missed out on a full weeks wage and got no Super to fall back on - No Holiday or sick pay. I think this should be taken into consideration.

As a carer, I face the following problems ...

Isolation, Health problems, Financial hardship, No Holidays, No Job opportunities, as what you earn P-TIME gets take off you in Respite fee's So Pointless trying to go to work.

Now my Husband has gone into Permanent Residential care, as he developed Dementia and it became too hard for me to look after him as much as I wanted to. I have health problems myself now. And having to look after him 24/7 became impossible, take into consideration, on the go all day and having to get up 4-5-6-7 and sometimes more every night to change the bed, or take him to the bathroom, or just to tell him that it was still night or early morning, was very frustrating and heart breaking. Now I don't know which is worse, having him home or leaving him in the home.

I still consider myself a carer as I go to see him almost everyday, I bring his washing home to do myself as I'm afraid I wasn't very happy about the way the laundry was done & so many articles of clothing got ruined, I had to buy new ones for him. Might I add that that expense come out of my Pension as this is ~~it~~ taken up in the cost of the home. Also I had to pay for his Medication until we finally reach the 'Net'. Thank god I don't have to pay anymore now until next Jan. I'll save \$50.00 per month.

So now I'm 64 yrs old, don't have any Super to fall back on, and am having to watch every cent I have. I think carers should still get part of the Bonus even if they don't have the person they care for at home. At least then they could maybe have a weeks holiday or treat themselves to something that they would probably be able to have if they were still working for a salary each week.

I still take my Husband for any appointments he has, so I'm using my car and I have to have petrol so I
