

I am submitting to the Inquiry because...

Due to my son's mental illness (schizo-affective disorder) he is very difficult to live with & also uses drugs as he does not want to take the medication. I have 2 younger children still at school & he is very disruptive to the family's harmony.

He needs assistance in his daily living yet can be independent with some aspects of his life - if there were more psycho-social rehab places (he has just had 2 years & had to move out, which precipitated another psychotic episode & eventually hospitalization which cost him his first job in 3 years) He now has to live on the Youth Allowance, rent of assistance & rent a \$150 drug unpleasant flat on his own - & my husband & I supplement his living. He wants to come home but we are concerned that the Y12 son will go down hill. It puts us in a very unhappy difficult situation)

More low prices housing would give more choices in situations like ours.

I am happy to talk to anyone further about these thoughts.

the most important is the following from the same author  
published in the *Journal of the Royal Society of Medicine* in 1926.  
The author says he studied many thousands of cases and  
concluded that the infected, were not at least 50%  
and very few patients had no ascites when they  
admitted to the hospital. He also found that 90%  
of patients had been under medical treatment before  
they had ascites. This is not to say that all patients  
with ascites had been under medical treatment before  
they had ascites. It is a logical inference that  
if a patient has ascites it is not unusual for him to have  
had appendicitis or some other disease that may have  
caused the ascites.

With regard to the cause of ascites in children  
there is no definite answer.
