



Dear Secretary,

I wish to make a submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee, Housing & youth's Inquiry into Better Support for Carers.

I care for my wife 24 hours per day — she was diagnosed with MS in 1986 & is now classed as a quadraplegic, I shower, dress, lift my wife in & out of bed & do everything — she has been in a wheelchair for 21 years, I have been doing the above for that length of time.

In the past 8 years I have had radiotherapy & surgery for skin cancer — we have been battling all this time to get HELP — & when we need it they say they "have run out of money". So my wife was only able to get despite for a week & that was the 1st TIME EVER.

When I get sick & go to hospital — help is needed to care for my wife — actually for the last 5 years I could have done with a carer myself.

Also when I need to go to Brisbane for specialist appointments it is extremely hard to get a carer for the day at home

Because of the lack of government funds - we have been forced to get private health cover for \$3,000 each per year - so when I go to hospital my wife comes too.

It costs more money when you are disabled for house renovations & surrounds, wheelchairs shower chair on wheels etc

The government should realise that I am saving the tax payer \$1500 per week by looking after my wife - & her NOT being in a nursing home.

So you can see the carers allowance of \$100.60 per fortnight is a pittance compared to the contribution I make & it would be so wonderful if we could get the care the government is always promising everyone "To KEEP US IN OUR OWN HOME"
