To Whom It May Concern:

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I am a single mother caring for my 33yr old son who has chronic illnesses and disabilities. I also suffer from serious health problems and am on a disability pension.

My son's condition varies from day to day due to the multiple problems, which he has. His care is 24hrs a day, 7 days a week, because of his condition. As a carer I get the Carer's Allowance which, if you care for someone 20hrs a week or 24hrs a day, it is the same money, which works out at \$7 a day.

As a carer, I am not only his carer; I have multiple tasks to do:

1. Mother

2. Carer

3. Secretary

4. Taxi Service

5. Home Duties

Only having 4 hours of respite a week, does not leave much time for myself. For these 4 hours of respite, we have to pay some of the cost. Being on a Disability Pension and paying rent it is impossible to have any other respite as this costs more money.

When I go to see the psychologist and it is suggested that I take a break, how can I afford to have a respite break, as we don't get holiday pay or superannuation?

I am sure that your job pays more than \$7 a day. How in the middle of the night, when we are so tired, our job is still ongoing. I am sure that your jobs are not 24hrs a day.
