I wish to make a submission to the House of Representatives Standing Committee on Family, Community, Housing and Youth's Inquiry into Better Support for Carers.

Briefly I will categorize my situation. I am 50 years of age and have three children. I care for

- 1) Scott, 14 yrs Severely Autistic - (non verbal)
- 2) Tom, 11 yrs Oppositional Defiant Disorder plus Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder
- 3) John, 15 yrs Speech & Language delay (now Mainstreamed).

I wish to alter the Terms of Reference and hope my input will be of benefit to you.

Cares assist people of any age to live a fulfilling, worthwhile existence. This can be recognised by increasing social awareness by media and community inclusion.

As a carer I would feel more able to achieve this with financial assistance as the government no longer provides institutions in which our loved ones could be placed, we have to look after them at home. This greatly increases isolation, and a full time burden on the whole family.

The barriers are:

Economic, as it costs money to employ staff to assist in the caring of "your person in need".

I am very isolated from "NORMAL" society.

Practical Measures.

I believe strongly, each state should have a FACILITY, "Resort", built.

So the person being cared for can go there and be spoilt; Pool, GYM, OUTINGS, ACTIVITIES, GARDENS, etc. For two full weeks every year so the CAREER can have a proper - stress free

break from caring - knowing their
loved one is well looked after.
This would give the carer TRUE RESPITE

It is should be made available to
all carers an up to date list of
volunteers & paid carers made available
for staffing from home. I may
have the funding but finding staffing
adequately trained, and training them
is not included in the funding allotment.
(Also the funding is not enough to get
the respite need, by myself.).

Post school options is also of major
concern. My sons supervision needs are
high and from what I can tell the
facilities "workshops" are inadequate
or even non existant

Occasional Respite Housing for people
of all ages (as I believe Scott my
16yo will not access Weekend Respite
after 18 years of age)

Group Homes, is essential, supervised
group housing is needed.

"Couples Respite" Weekends - counsellors &
social integration needed.

Strategies

I believe the government has many good strategies in place.

To enhance these existing would require more funding, the strategy is good just not enough money to implement it/ them.

Definitely more money is needed in the care industry and possibly amalgamation of services so there is no overlap.

The Local Area Co-ordinator is invaluable - they can help carers access services.

Services Needed. - (not in order).

: Red Cross : monthly support group.
: i.dentigwa. weekend respite
... personal workshops.
couple workshops.

" autism assoc. weekend respite

: silver chain : Commonwealth Respite Care Services. - (more funding needed)

- Silver Chain have a quite like that allows a ~~+~~ silverchain worker to come into the home to look after the "disabled child" but will not look after my other two children - what do I do I lock them in the shed so I can go out for respite.
