## TO WHOM IT CONCERNS - HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES STANDING COMMITTEE ON FAMILY AND HUMAN SERVICES

We have read the terms of reference and now offer our opinion on both points:

## 1. We believe there needs to be unified adoption policy across all states and territiories.

The administration of these policies should continue to be at state/territory level, but the Act and all policies, should be Australian Government designed, incorporating the Antidiscrimination Act, thereby not excluding potentially 'fit parents' from applying and being assessed.

## 2. We fully support the equal payment of all entitlements for all new parents.

There should be no discrepancy between entitlements whether the son / daughter is a new member of the family biologically or via adoption.

The age of the child should also not be relevant, as the set up costs for a new child into the family are costly, regardless of their age.

Infact, the cost of caring for a child's needs increases as they age - more extra curricular activities, more school resources needed,

and the obvious, more expensive basic upkeep!!! This we know from experience as we have three beautiful biological boys, aged 7, 9 &11.

Thank you for finally seeing to this social injustice. We trust these inconsistencies will now be corrected.
