How can the Australian Government better assist Australians <u>who are adopting</u> <u>or have adopted</u> children from overseas countries?

OVERVIEW

Most important considerations for the Australian Government

- Focus must be on a needy child coming into a <u>family</u>. All children have a right to grow up in a natural family of father & mother. Adoption should always be about looking after the good and rights of children, and not the supposed "rights" of those who wish to adopt.
- The best interests of the child should always be the prime consideration.

General considerations regarding the adoption process:

- Elimination of dead time. More staff, more resources, more efficient use of time to substantially shorten the pre adoption process.
- Focus on issues relevant to intercountry adoption, otherwise more time is wasted.
- Establish open two way channels of communication to eliminate stress and isolation. Common courtesy is essential.
- Shortening post allocation time by eliminating potential problems.
- Avoidance of judgemental attitudes.
- Elimination of duplication for those parents adopting another child.
- Public Education to significantly improve attitudes towards adoption in order to overcome unfortunate negative connotations. Adoption should be considered **a genuine, honourable and esteemed option.**
- Accountability. Let's raise the standards!
- Consideration by way of tax deductions/rebates towards the huge financial burden of adoptive parents. This needs to be inclusive of a family's current and previous adoption.
