Why are women leaving the force? WA Police Commissioner to appear before parliamentary inquiry

The Western Australian Police Commissioner, Karl O'Callahan, and representatives of the Police Service will give evidence tomorrow (30 June) in Perth for the current parliamentary inquiry into balancing work and family.

The Commissioner has previously said that the Frontline First campaign, which is taking officers away from desks and putting them back on to the streets, was increasing the agency's focus on issues of child care, family commitments, and leave time for police officers.

In exit interviews, many female officers are citing the lack of child care and flexible working arrangements as their reason for leaving. The Police Service's submission to the inquiry says that these issues need to be addressed, particularly in regional and remote areas, if the force is to meet looming recruitment challenges.

The Commissioner will be joined by representatives from BHP Billiton who have been working with the Police Service on work force attraction and retention remote areas of Western Australia.

Committee Chair Bronwyn Bishop said, "It's encouraging to see an organisation being proactive about work force problems that will only be exacerbated by Australia's ageing population. Enabling employees to better balance work and family life will not only make for happier families, but will benefit business in increased retention rates and worker loyalty."

The Hon Sue Ellery MLC, Parliamentary Secretary, will give evidence on behalf of the Minister for Employment Protection and the Western Australian Government. Former Australian of Year, Professor Fiona Stanley, will also appear to share her views on early childhood development.
