Balancing work and family in Defence

Senior representatives from Defence will give evidence to the House of Representatives Families Committee in Darwin on Monday (21 August 2006) for its inquiry into balancing work and family.

The Defence representatives will include Commander of the 1st Brigade, Brigadier Craig Orme and the Director-General of the Defence Community Organisation, Ms Janet Stodulka.

The Defence Community Organisation runs a number of support programs for defence staff and their families, including access to child care, counselling and emergency support.

The hearing will also canvass the views of the families of defence personnel.

Committee Chairman Bronwyn Bishop said, "During these times of heightened security concerns, we are relying on our defence personnel more than ever. A stable home life gives our service men and women a secure foundation to keep up their important work in defending Australia."

The Northern Territory Chamber of Commerce and Industry will also give evidence. One of the themes of the inquiry is whether being family-friendly helps firms attract quality staff or imposes costs because management needs to spend more effort in ensuring clients' needs are met.
