Tax Commissioner to discuss the tax treatment of child care

The Commissioner of Taxation, Michael D'Ascenzo, will brief the House Families Committee on the tax treatment of child care at a public hearing for its inquiry into balancing work and family in Canberra on Wednesday, 29 November at 10.45 am.

The main issues about how child care is taxed are:

- Employer provided child care is subject to fringe benefits tax unless it is conducted on the business premises of the employer. Most employers find it difficult to meet the 'business premises' test, which the Tax Office has interpreted in a public ruling; and
- Tax deductions that are of a private nature are not allowed. The Tax Office has issued an interpretative decision confirming that child care is a private expense.

At the public hearing on 1 November, the Committee took evidence from McMillan Shakespeare, a leading provider of salary packaging services. The firm stated that it had spent \$100,000 in attempting to obtain a private ruling from the Australian Tax Office to provide more flexible salary packaging for child care. McMillan Shakespeare is yet to be successful.

The Committee Chairman Bronwyn Bishop said, "Witnesses have argued at public hearings that the Australian Tax Office is a road block to flexible child care provision. The Committee believes the ATO should have a right of reply".

"In the Welfare to Work program, the government has recognised that child care is a requirement for working. I don't see why one principle applies to people on welfare to work and another applies to people who are already paying tax," the Chairman said.
