## Child Care Centre Vacancy Alert will help parents find child care

Child Care Centre Vacancy Alert is an efficient mechanism for coordinating the supply and demand of child care services. It provides much needed support and information for families looking for care and eliminates the arduous cycle of searching, waitlisting and waiting.

This information can also be accessed by Child Care Centres in corresponding postcodes/regions





On an ongoing basis, CareforKids.com.au communicates with child care centres advising that there are parents looking for vacancies in their area Meanwhile, CareforKids.com.au continues to up-date parents on the progress of their search. Parents are also required to keep their Child Care Vacancy Alert information up-to-date



As a vacancy becomes available, Child Care Centres access the Child Care Vacancy Alert database to find families whose requirement matches their vacancy



The Child Care Centre then selects a family to match their vacancy and contacts them direct

In essence, Child Care Centre Vacancy Alert widens the net by creating more opportunities and taking the search for a vacancy across a wider range of centres, therefore increasing the chance of finding a placement faster.

In addition to the benefit derived by families, Child Care Centre Vacancy Alert can also be applied to offer great value to organisations looking to identify and address areas with child care shortages.
